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


DISTRICT III MEETING



MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Give a cheer, winter is here and the forecast is un-brrr-lieveable. Everyone can use some words of inspiration during these incredibly unique and difficult times. Just watching the news can create panic or depression, particularly for those who are quarantined without others around them or an extended family/friend support system. The School Nutrition Association is here as a beacon of support for its members.

Now more than ever with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, your SNA membership helps ensure that our nation's children are well nourished and prepared for success. The September 2020 Membership Report shows that we have 52,031 members. This is an increase of 169 members as compared to August 2020, but still 4,909 less than September 2019 and 2,517 less than May 2020 year-end total. This overall drop in membership related to the COVID-19 pandemic is still a major concern, but the small increase in numbers from past months is a positive sign and hopefully a trend that continues.

Recruiting new members remains crucial to the continued success of our Association. So what can we do this year to help increase our membership? Simple, if all existing members worked to recruit just one new member; we would immediately double our membership. Think of how much greater our voice would be to advocate on behalf of our members and the children we serve. I encourage you to BRING A FRIEND to your next meeting, gathering, or event.
