
Jamie Narron



- 3. Preserve USDA Foods entitlement and State Administrative Expense funds, impacted by COVID-19.
 - 4. Reduce regulatory and administrative burdens.

School Nutrition Association of NC 2021 Legislative Agenda

February 19, 2021

Since March 16, 2020, NC School Nutrition professionals served more than 100 million meals to children across the state: using school buses through neighborhood deliveries, drive-by pickups,

rolling food carts in school hallways, bundling up multiple meals on Fridays to sustain children through the weekend – whatever it took to get the job done. We were and are the boots-on-the-ground in the face of the pandemic feeding our children no matter what. The School Nutrition Association of NC (SNA-NC) is thankful to all state and federal leaders for their unwavering support and dedication to feeding our school children during this unprecedented time. SNA-NC respectfully requests the following as you continue your commitment of excellence to School Nutrition into 2021 and beyond:

1. Recurring Funds and Carryover Authority to Make Permanent your 2020 Elimination of the Student Copay for Reduced Priced Meals.

In H.B. 1023 (SL 2020-80), you appropriated our requested \$3.9 million – for 1 year only – to eliminate the student co-pay for reduced priced meals. This was designed to help approximately 65,000 NC children who would have otherwise had to pay the reduced price under normal circumstances. This State funding, if made recurring this year, will remove the financial burden created by the reduced price student co-pay and will significantly increase students' access to healthy lunches at school.

SNA-NC is very grateful for this 2020 one-time relief, and we ask that you please make this \$3.9 million a <u>recurring appropriation</u>, the same way that the State funds students' co-pays for reduced price breakfast. We also request that you grant <u>immediate carryover authority</u> for the continued use of any remaining 2020 funds. Due to the environment of serving meals during the COVID pandemic, along with additional United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) waivers and relief funding, our students need to use these funds beyond the 2020-21 school year.

2. Provide Relief from Assessment of Indirect Costs because School Nutrition Programs are struggling to restore financial solvency due to the pandemic.

In order to preserve financial resources of School Nutrition programs, state law defines financial solvency as one-month operating balance in N.G. General Statute 115C-450. A local School Nutrition program must have at least a one-month operating balance before its school system can assess indirect costs, payable back to that local school system. SNA-NC is thankful that the General Assembly recognizes the need to preserve the financial resources of the programs before allowing the assessment of indirect costs.

Due to the financial impact of the pandemic, School Nutrition programs are struggling to restore financial solvency in order to meet their payroll and operating expenditures. School Nutrition programs depend on federal reimbursement and savings to meet these needs, so that they continue to focus on the nutritional needs of the students.

SNA-NC humbly requests revisions to N.C. General Statute 115C-450 to reflect the impact the pandemic has had on the programs. Changing the state law, for example, from one-month operating balance to three months' operating balance would be a great start.

3. Fund Hospitalization and Retirement Costs for School Nutrition employees.

The NC General Assembly appropriates funds each year for the hospitalization and retirement costs for employees of local boards of education, except for School Nutrition employees. This is shocking news to many, but it is unfortunately true. In 2020, School Nutrition programs paid tens of millions out of their own local funds for these two state personnel benefits, resulting in less funds to support students' nutritional needs. Please consider providing funding to the School Nutrition programs to offset these benefits especially because they are the only full-time school employees who have to pay from their own local program-generated funds for these critical costs.

Due to the pandemic, we are at real risk of losing our trained professionals entirely; many have left the profession already since March 2020. Furthermore, School Nutrition programs do not have enough in federal reimbursement funds to continue paying – out of our local program funds – for our employees' hospitalization and retirement costs without funding from the State.


