SNA-NC Board of Directors Meeting

June 22, 2021

Sheraton Four Seasons, Greensboro, NC

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 9:09 a.m. by *Kristen Bealler, President*. Kristen welcomed everyone to the meeting, shared both the Vision and Mission statements and *Dana Edwards, President Elect* shared the "Thought for the Day".

BUSINESS AGENDA

Roll call was completed by *Janet Johnson*, *Secretary-Treasurer*.

The Agenda was adopted by the Board.

A budget update was provided by *Mary Ann Shoaf*, *Bookkeeper*. Information was shared that indicated that during the year there was a need to use some funds from the BB&T savings account but that there was no need to draw from our reserve funds.

A Mega Discussion was held on "A Journey into the Unknown". This discussion was centered on House Bill 159 (HB159) which is asking for legislation to change the requirement that a school nutrition program must have three months operating balance before being assessed indirect cost as well as a rate capped of eight (8%). There have been many outside organizations that are partnering to support the change.

Mary-Catherine Talton provided a legislative update and shared that SNA (National) has asked for support in seeking universal meals.

Dana Edwards, President Elect provided an update regarding the SNA-NC Annual Conference. This information included that there are 225 registered. The conference will consist of four education sessions. There will be colored bands available at the registration table that can be used as an indicator of the personal preference regarding COVID-19 protocols.

Dawn Roth, Executive Director provided an update on the Trade Show. There will be 111 booths – tabletops display. The vendors will provide individually wrapped items to the attendees. Attendees will enter and remain with their school districts. Directional markers have been placed on the floor to help with flow of traffic as well as continuing to adhere to social distancing and COVID-19 protocols in place. The ribbon cutting will be at 9:20 a.m.

Dana Edwards, President Elect provided her Plan of Work – "Bloom into Your Potential" for 2021 – 2022 as well as the budget.

Kristen Bealler, President lead a discussion related to the contracts for the following positions and all were approved:

Legislative Update

This fall feels a little different than last year, or really any year before. While there is still a lingering pandemic and many unknowns there is a hopefulness in the air, a back to school feel that we have been missing for two years now.

Even with that hopefulness, legislatively there is still so much work to be done and so much that is currently happening. If you attended conference and attended the Public Policy and Legislation session you are aware that we left conference with a hope of HB159 passing through the Senate with a known opposition. This bill did not pass through unamended as we had hoped and the provision regarding indirect cost was struck and made into a study by the Senate Finance committee. While disheartening, we continue to work with our General Assembly to ensure the understanding of these requests and provisions. We continue to push forward.

Your Public Policy and Legislation committee, Executive Committee, and lobbyist, Rachel Beaulieu have all worked and communicated often on next steps and will continue to have those conversations on

behalf of you and your programs. We currently are still having conversations, alongside NC DPI, the State Superintendent, and many other partnerships who want to ensure the best for our programs as that is ultimately best for our students.

There is also a continued talk of the salary increase for non-certified staff that has made its appearance in the budget. We welcome these changes for our staff but we also want to ensure there is knowledge of where this money comes from and that School Nutrition programs do not receive funding from the state for these mandates, thus having to incur the cost within our programs. There is no better time than now to call your NC Senators

and House members to discuss your programs, how they are funded, and how we need them to fund that which they mandate.

There is, indeed, a hope-fulness for the future and many conversations circling regarding school nutrition programs, for both we are thankful. There is still much work to be done and a way for everyone to be involved. It's time to raise our voices and make a difference legislatively for the very programs that ensure nourished bodies for healthy minds.

and Teresa Graham of Pilgrim's.


